#### NO PLAN TO RE-INTRODUCE RS. 1,000 NOTE

"Complaints of cash shortages at ATMs are being addressed, says the Economic Affairs Secretary"

Finance Minister Arun Jaitley said the remonetisation situation with regard to replenishing the scrapped currency was "almost normal" now and the RBI was monitoring the supply on a daily basis.

The government announced the withdrawal of old Rs. 500 and Rs. 1,000 notes on Nov 8, 2016, with the aim to check black money, counterfeit notes and terror financing.
